TAMIAMI AMATEUR RADIO CLUB Minutes of the Meeting 09 November 2011

President Stew Haag-W4MO called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM and, following a flag salute, introductions were made all around. Section Manager Dee Turner-N4GD of Pinellas Park, Lenee Owens of Sarasota, Diane Gaddas of Venice, Ken Gooding of Rotonda, Jim Semradek of Placida and Robert Unsell of Venice were welcomed as visitors.

MINUTES – Secretary Jack Sproat-W4JS reported that the Treasurer's Report was shown with an error in the minutes of the 12 October 2011 meeting published in the November 2011 issue of *The Communicator*, due to a typo by the secretary. The closing balance was \$1835.03, and the error has been corrected in the minutes on record. A motion to accept the corrected minutes was made by Fred Lathwood-KJ4TNI, seconded by Mel Bullock-W4PSE, and passed.

CORRESPONDENCE – An interesting and informative letter from Martin Zippe-AF4ID/DJ6OM was read by the secretary.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Treasurer Don Jansen-KI4VGE read the Treasurer's Report for October. The starting balance was \$1835.03. Receipts were \$18.00 from the October 50/50, \$100 from dues and an \$18 donation from Fred Lathwood-KJ4TNI, totaling \$136.00. Expenses were \$14.95 for Internet service and \$5 for the attendance drawing, totaling \$19.95. The ending balance is \$1951.08. Bob Avrutik-N1RA moved for acceptance of the report, seconded by Dil Kay-W8DIL, and passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SUNSHINE – Stew-W4MO reported that he had talked via Skype to Martin Zippe-AF4ID/DJ6OM and that Martin was in good spirits. Stew then read the following e-mail which was received from Bob Miller-KJ4NLP who is convalescing. "At midweek I had the staples removed, and am now in the healing stage of the three incisions. It will be a few weeks more before I'm permitted to drive. Please convey to the members of TARC my appreciation for their get-well card and encouragement."

VE TESTING – Our next VE session will be this Saturday 12 November. To date there have been no inquiries.

REPEATER/TECHNICAL – The 146 and 444 MHz repeaters are operational in both analog and digital modes. The remote Flex 3000 is in service. Anyone wishing to access the Flex needs to contact Stew-W4MO for procedures.

CLUB PROPERTY – The inventory of club property has not changed.

PUBLICITY/MEMBERSHIP – San Yoder-K3SY reported that we have a total of 73 members and reminded all that 2012 dues are now due.

NET OPERATIONS – Stew commented that turnout for our nets remains very poor.

LIAISON TO QCWA – There were 27 members and spouses present at the 02 November luncheon/meeting of Suncoast Chapter 53. Hans Napfel-WB2ZZB presented his PP program on The Greatest Inventors. Visitors are welcome to our group the first Wednesday of the month at Denny's on Bee Ridge Road in Sarasota

OLD BUSINESS – Nothing carried over.

NEW BUSINESS – Stew announced that the Annual Election will be held at the 14 December meeting of our Club. Therefore, as per Article VI, Para 21 of the TARC Bylaws, "At a regularly scheduled November meeting of the Club, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee comprised of a chairman and not less than two members." Stew then appointed the current Directors to form the Nominating Committee and select their Chairman.

COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR – WCF Section Manager Dee Turner-N4GD briefly presented an overview of Section activities, noting that several new clubs had formed and affiliated with the ARRL. Dee offered Tampa Bay Hamfest tickets for sale at the discounted price, and contributed an ARRL World Map for inclusion in the 50-50 raffle.

Andy Durette-KB1HIP asked if there has been any interest in a training class for the Technician license. Jack-W4JS stated he would contact Steve Case-WC4SE, co-sponsor of the Venice High School ARC in this matter. Guenther Hennig-AJ4QX commented that there had been about four Coast Guard Auxiliary personnel interested but he would have to determine the current status of such interest.

Guenther-AJ4QX reported he had contacted a person who is capable of installing the electric starter kit on our generator, and he will arrange a time for follow up.

Stew-W4MO offered 12 HTs that have been programmed for several 440 MHz repeaters, in an effort to get members onto those machines.



-- NOVEMBER SOLAR ACTIVITY --

During November the Solar Flux ranged from 133 to 181, with a mean value of 152.8 (vs. 82.6 for November 2010 and 73.6 for November 2009). The A-index was ≥ 7 on 7 days. Through 29 November, the sunspot number ranged from 90 to 220, with a mean of 136.9. Sunspot Regions 1334 thru 1364 were active during November, with 201 C-class, 13 M-class and one X-Class flares occurring.

-- DECEMBER FORECAST --

Solar activity is forecast to be at predominantly low levels during December, with a slight chance of isolated M-class flares.

No proton events at geosynchronous orbit are expected. The greater than 2 MeV electron flux

at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at normal levels during the month. The Solar Flux should average 151 during December.

The geomagnetic field should be quiet with the exception of 02, 9-10, 23 and 27-29 December when quiet to unsettled levels are expected due to recurrent coronal hole high speed streams.

-- 60-METER BAND CHANGES --

On 18 November 2011, the FCC released a Report and Order with new 5MHz rules for the 60-meter band to take effect 30 days after publication in the Federal Register.

The FCC adopted the use of the name "60 meter band" to refer to 5MHz amateur radio in the frequency range 5330.5-5406.4 kHz, but USA General, Advanced and Amateur Extra class hams are still only allowed to transmit on 5 specific channels in the band.

The FCC changed the rules to allow Phone (USB only), RTTY, Data, and CW; with specific limitations on the use of these modes. Data or RTTY operators must be careful to limit the length of transmission to avoid causing harmful interference to US Government stations.


Note: The FCC deleted the channel at 5366.5 USB (center=5368.0) and "replaced" it with channel 5357.0 kHz USB (center=5358.5)

The maximum allowed power level is now 100Watts PEP (ERP) effective radiated power referenced to a dipole. If another type of antenna is used, the station licensee must maintain a record of either the antenna manufacturer's data on the antenna gain or calculations of the antenna gain.

Upper Sideband Phone, Data, or RTTY transmissions may use dial (VFO) USB suppressed carrier frequency at 1.5 kHz below the center of the channel. Transmissions must not exceed the 2.8kHz bandwidth channel. RTTY modes such as PSK31 must not exceed 60Hz necessary bandwidth. Data modes must not exceed 2.8 kHz bandwidth. CW bandwidth must not exceed 150Hz bandwidth and the CW frequency should be at the center of the channel.

Data stations operating under Section §97.221 automatically controlled digital station, are not allowed on these 5MHz channels.
