On the left can be seen a section of Bob's Hy-Tower vertical used for 80m & 40m; on the right is his 50' US Tower crank-up at about 35' with yagis for 30m through 6m & 2m. Bob also has a wire antenna up for 160m.

LIAISON TO QCWA: There were 37 Suncoast Chapter 53 members and spouses at the November 2nd lunch/meeting at the IHop restaurant in Sarasota. Dennis Blanchard, K1YPP, gave a program describing his bicycle experiences riding from Oregon to Sarasota. Any and all are welcome to join us the first Wednesday of each month at about 11:30 AM. The QCWA is changing its restaurant meeting location due to the sudden closure of Denny's. Please contact a member if you would like to attend the December lunch/meeting.

REPEATER / TECHNICAL: Both the 146.805 MHz repeater and the 444.10 digital repeaters are operating satisfactorily.

MEMBERSHIP: San Yoder reported that the club had 65 members. The breakdown is: 52 regular members, 7 student, 4 life, 2 comp. 2017 dues will be able to be paid during the November meeting. Remember, if you invite a Ham or an interested person to the meeting you can earn an extra red ticket for the 50-50 drawing.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Christmas Party - The Christmas Party will be held at the Left Coast Seafood Restaurant, Venice, FL on December 16th. Cocktails, 4:00PM - 5:00PM, Dinner, 5:00PM - 7:00 PM.

The club will pay for members' meals. Members must pay for wives and guests. Cost is \$30.00 each. Members will receive an E-mail detailing dinner choices and the address to which checks must be sent.

-- NOVEMBER SOLAR ACTIVITY --

During November, the 10.7 cm Solar Flux ranged from 75 to 86, with a mean value of 78.7 (vs. 109.6 for November 2015 and 155.3 for November 2014), and the A_p index was \geq 7 on 18 days. Through 29 November, the sunspot number ranged from 0 to 51, with a mean of 20.6.

Solar activity through to 29 November was quiet with two Class M and five Class C solar flares. Geomagnetic disturbances caused the A_p to peak at 32 on the 1^{st} , 32 to 39 on 10-11 Nov. and 39-48 on 24-25 Nov.

-- DECEMBER FORECAST -

Solar activity is expected to be at very low levels with a slight chance for C-class flares for the month. No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at normal to moderate levels with high levels likely on 01-07 December, 10-18 December and again on 22-24 December due to recurrent CH HSS influence.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at unsettled to active levels are expected from 07-11 December and 19-24 December with G1 (Minor) geomagnetic storm levels likely on 10 and 21-22 December due to recurrent CH HSS effects.

The 10.7 cm Solar Flux should range from 78 to 84 and average 80.5 during December.

Bob also has an IC-7800 driving a legal limit Alpha amp. Bob's usually on CW—see his Vibroplex banner--but note that Heil boom mounted mike in the right foreground.

-- THE ANTENNAS AT W4JS --



Ron LeBrun-KB4RON is dwarfed by the 40m-6m SteppIR and Cushcraft 40m beam at the QTH of Jack Sproat-W4JS. There's a decent chance the 40m beam will be replaced sometime in the coming Spring with a 7-element 6m beam in Jack's quest for 6m DXCC.

Jack has had a variety of towers and beams over the past 20 years at this QTH. In early 1997 a 72' motorized US Tower supported the Cushcraft A-3S, A-3WS and 40-2CD beams. A HyGain TH-11 replaced the A-3S and A-3WS

around 2000. The raising cable broke on the tower in 2004, so the TH-11 was put atop a 60' AlumaTower erected about 125' to the south. In 2007, the disabled US Tower was replaced with this 70' Rohn 45 tower with a 4-el SteppIR at 72' and the reliable 40m beam at 86'. In 2013, the driven element on the SteppIR was replaced with the "trombone element" to give the antenna 40m to 6m capability.



These radios and antennas helped bring Jack's DXCC total up to 350 entities on Phone. On the left is his CW/RTTY station, an IC-7600 driving an ICOM PW1 kw amp (on the floor below the desk drawers). His SSB station is on the right; a vintage IC-775DSP driving a Tokyo Hy-Power HL-1.5KFX kw amp on the shelf above. (Yeah, lots of wires and cables under the desk!)



-- STATUS OF SOLAR CYCLE 24 --

The sun has looked remarkably blank lately, with few dark cores interrupting the featureless solar disk. This is a sign that Solar Minimum is coming. Indeed, sunspot counts have just reached their lowest level since 2011. With respect to the sunspot cycle, you are here:



The solar cycle is like a pendulum, swinging back and forth between periods of high and low sunspot number every 11 years. These data from NOAA show that the pendulum is swinging toward low sunspot numbers even faster than expected. (The red line is the forecast; black dots are actual measurements.). Given the current progression, forecasters expect the cycle to bottom out with a deep Solar Minimum in 2019-2020.

Solar Minimum is widely misunderstood. Many people think it brings a period of dull quiet. In fact, space weather changes in interesting ways. For instance, as the extreme ultraviolet output of the sun decreases, the upper atmosphere of Earth cools and collapses. This allows space junk to accumulate around our planet. Also, the heliosphere shrinks, bringing interstellar space closer to Earth; galactic cosmic rays penetrate the inner solar system and our atmosphere with relative ease. Meanwhile, geomagnetic storms and auroras will continue--caused mainly by solar wind streams instead of CMEs. Indeed, Solar Minimum is coming, but it won't be dull.

Hugh "Cass" Cassidy-WA6AUD (SK) and his wife published the weekly WCDXB for just over 11 years—some 600 issues of that very unique DX newsletter that was run off on a mimeograph machine and sent out via first class mail. While your editor cannot claim as many issues, we have been plugging along alone, preparing this newsletter, for at least 16 or 17 years. At their final gathering, the leader of the Palos Verdes Sundancers stated to Cass, "I can understand how you can grow a bit weary. Down in the Palos Verdes country all the PV types worked so hard to get Cycle 21 going that they seem to have lost all their bounce. And you know what happens to a dancer who has lost his bounce." Most all will agree, for most are now at an age where they have less of a bounce than in a time now gone.

Also, in all honesty, your editor is finding his primary ham radio interests to be out of sync with the apparent majority of current TARC members. When we joined TARC in 1998, virtually every member was active on HF. Now the resident members active on HF number around 10 or so, with but a handful of serious DXers.
