#### -- STORM CHASER-WJØG --

(The death of these three men was rather well covered in the media, but none of the MSM articles mentioned that Tim Samaras was a ham.)

Professional storm chasers Tim Samaras-WJØG, his son Paul Samaras and fellow investigator Carl Young died May 31 near El Reno, Oklahoma, when an EF3 tornado suddenly



changed paths and slammed into their vehicle, and they were unable to escape. In his biography on The Weather Channel website, Tim Samaras said that he always carried Amateur Radio along equipment when he chased storms. "I chase the most powerful storms on the planet," Tim Samaras said in a video on his personal

website. "At times I have mixed feelings about chasing these storms. On one hand they are incredibly beautiful; on the other hand, these powerful storms can create devastating damage that change people's lives forever." The TWISTEX tornado research team that Tim Samaras founded has been featured on The Discovery Channel's "Storm Chasers.

#### -- DAYTON HOLDS STEADY --

The Dayton Hamvention website has announced that 24,542 people attended this year, up 59 from last year's attendance. The Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA) has sponsored Hamvention since 1952. Originally called the Southwestern Ohio Hamvention, the inaugural event, held in March in downtown Dayton, attracted 600 attendees--twice the number anticipated. Hamvention attendance peaked at 33,669 in 1993, before the 1996 change in date from April to May (and before the depression kicked in). While attendance has fluctuated over the years. Dayton Hamvention has grown to international proportions, attracting members of the worldwide Amateur Radio community each spring. On its website DARA already is counting down the days, hours and minutes until the next Dayton Hamvention, which takes place May 16, 17 and 18, 2014.

About themselves, they will only say that they are all kit-builders and ham radio operators, and feel that revealing their identities at this time will distract them from the task of getting the company off the ground.

#### -- JUNE SOLAR ACTIVITY --

The Solar Flux ranged from 90 to 133, with a mean value of 110.3 (vs. 120.6 for June 2012 and 95.8 for June 2011), and the  $A_p$  index was  $\geq$  7 on 19 days. The sunspot number through 29 June ranged from 14 to 137, with a mean of 79.8. Sunspot Regions 1761 to 1782 were active, with five M-class and 58 C-class flares.

It was another "rough month" with the  $A_p$  index hitting 54 on 01 June, 34 on 07 June during five active days, 17 on 21 June during six active days and 56 on 29 June during four active days. G2 and G3 level geomagnetic storms caused radio blackouts.

#### -- JULY FORECAST -

Solar activity is expected to be very low to low with a chance for M-class flares 01 through 14 July with the return of old Region 1768.

No greater than 10 MeV proton events are expected.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at high levels 01 through 07 July and 19 through 20 July in response to recurrent coronal hole high speed streams.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be quiet 01 to 04 July with quiet to unsettled conditions 05 to 06 July due to recurrent CHHSS. Quiet conditions are expected 07 to 16 July, quiet to unsettled conditions on 17 July and unsettled to active levels 18 to 27 July due to recurrent CHHSS.

The Solar Flux should range from 105 to 130 and average 117.3 during July.

#### -- WAKE ISLAND OPERATION --



The team reports that plans for its upcoming K9W operation this fall are "progressing nicely." Most of the needed equipment is in hand and being checked out before shipment to staging areas in California and Hawaii. The operation will commemorate 98 US civilians who died on Wake in October 1943 during WW II.

A team of 12 operators is being assembled with plans to operate five stations over a 14-day period on all modes, 160 through 6 meters. The team anticipates that the operation will start the last week of September or first week of October, depending on the military flight schedule into and out of Wake. — K9W Wake Atoll Management Team via ARRL News, 30 June 2013.

#### -- FCC CITES ONLINE RETAILER --

The FCC has cited an Omaha, Nebraska based online retailer for marketing unauthorized RF devices, including high power 10 and 12 meter amplifiers, in violation of FCC rules. An FCC "Citation and Order" released June 6 orders Enterprise Group Inc, doing business as ePowerAmps, to immediately stop advertising, marketing and selling "all unauthorized radio frequency devices, specifically modified Citizens Band (CB) radios and non-certified RF amplifiers for use in the 10 and 12 meter bands" or face possible fines and seizure of equipment.

An agent from the FCC's Kansas City office observed on ePowerAmps' website "illegally modified CB radios being offered for sale," as well as various modifications and upgrades. These included swapping out the original final amplifier for a higher powered replacement. Linear amplifiers offered for sale varied between 120 W and 8200 W (emphasis added), and the Commission said none of the 50 linears offered for sale appeared to have FCC certification.

The FCC gave ePowerAmps 30 days to confirm "in writing" that it has stopped marketing

unauthorized RF devices and to provide certain information to the Commission.

#### -- HAMSTUDY.ORG ON THE WWW --

Icom America has announced sponsorship for HamStudy.org. This is a new website that offers free learning tools for existing and potential amateur radio operators.

HamStudy.org users studying for an amateur radio license exam can choose from three online learning modules for each ham radio license class. These are Technician, General or Amateur Extra. FCC Commercial Element 1, 3, 5 and 6 study modules are also available.

Educational materials include flash cards, question lists and practice tests. Users who register for a free account can access personalized study history and submit explanations to amateur radio questions. Website registrants may also choose to log into their account using their Google or Facebook credentials.
