President Fred Lathwood-KJ4TNI called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with a flag pledge. Introductions were then made all around with Jim Wedin (KJ4QMJ), Gene Bates (KE0DD) and Gary Riedel (KJ4KHM) being welcomed as visitors.

MINUTES – Fred requested a motion to accept the minutes of the 13 May 2015 meeting as published in the June 2015 issue of *The Communicator*. Glenn Hyde-N4MXQ so moved, seconded by Gary Hagens-K6OC, and passed.

CORRESPONDENCE – A \$100 check was given to the Special Athlete Boosters from TARC.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Treasurer San Yoder-K3SY reported that the starting balance was \$5,137.07. Receipts were \$13 from the May 50/50, \$75 for PC sales, \$11 for K4S donations and \$89 for TARC donations for a total of \$188. --FCC SCALES BACK OFFICE CLOSURES --

Leaders of the US House Energy and Commerce Committee have reached agreement with FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler to amend the Commission's plans--announced in March--to close a number of FCC field offices. Under the revised plan, the FCC will keep 15 of its 24 field offices open. According to a Committee media release, the plan would "ensure better rapid response capabilities for the West, provide a mechanism for escalating interference complaints, improve enforcement of the FCC's rules against pirate radio operators, and prevent the Commission from transferring field office jobs to FCC Headquarters." The FCC had been under pressure from lawmakers and others to step back from its plan to shutter the field offices.

MAJOR CURRENT/UPCOMING DX ACTIVITY & PROPAGATION HIGHLIGHTS

Notes: **Time in bold** = the Bands with 75-100% opening; ??? = Call Sign not yet known; ++ = Mostly SSB; ** = Mostly CW; NO = No Opening forecast. Long Path bearings and opening times are underlined. All forecasts calculated using *W6ELProp* propagation software. Solar Flux and K-index varied by date in accordance with the NOAA SWPC 27-day Space Weather Outlook Table and USAF 45 Day AP Forecast.

-- JUNE SOLAR ACTIVITY --

Through 29 June the 10.7 cm Solar Flux ranged from 97 to 140, with a mean value of 124.0 (vs. 122.2 for June 2014 and 110.2 for June 2013), and the A_p index was \geq 7 on 20 days. Through 28 June, the sunspot number ranged from 25 to 136, with a mean of 80.1.

Space weather during June ranged from quiet to severe storms with 12 M-class and 186 Cclass flares through the 29^{th} . Severe geomagnetic disturbances from multiple CMEs peaked the A_p at 80 on the 8^{th} , 236 on the 22^{nd} , 179 on the 23^{rd} and 67 on 25 June.

-- JULY FORECAST --

Solar activity is expected to be at low levels, with a chance of M-class flares during July.

From 11 through 24 July there is a chance for greater than 10 MeV proton events.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at high levels 08-19 July due to recurrent CH HSS effects.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at active to minor storm levels 06-08 and 11-12 July due to recurrent CH HSS.

The 10.7 cm Solar Flux should range from 100 to 130 and average 114.7 during July.





-- ANOTHER K4S ON THE AIR --



The K4S QSL on top is used by the TARC in response to QSLs for our operation on behalf of the Venice Sharks Tooth Festival.

The lower K4S QSL commemorates the worst maritime disaster in US history. The SS Sultana was one of the largest sidewheel steamboats of its time, rated to carry 376 people, but overloaded with 2,427 passengers, 100 livestock and some freight when a boiler exploded 27 April 1865 near Memphis, Tennessee. Loss of life was an estimated 1,800-2,400 persons. The vast majority of passengers were just released Union POWs who boarded at Vicksburg, Mississippi and were headed up the flooded Mississippi River to northern states.

While the "official" review of the incident blamed the explosion on poorly repaired boilers, there's good probability that a coal bomb had been planted in the *Sultana*'s coal bin. Dedicated Confederate agents had blown up some 60 steamboats on the Mississippi after that river was lost to federal control. The first mate of the *Sultana* survived and told a reporter that some "infernal machine" must have been put in the coal as the boat "was running very steady and so little steam on that an explosion was impossible."

So, quite diverse uses of the K4S call sign for both current and historical interest.

-- BILL PASTERNAK-WA6ITF, SK --

A well-known voice in the Amateur Radio news media has gone silent. Bill Pasternak-WA6ITF, of Santa Clarita, California, died 11 June at age 73 following a period of ill health. Pasternak was co-founder (with Jim Hendershot-WA6VQP) of *Amateur Radio Newsline*[™] (formerly *The Westlink Report*) ham radio news webcast. Pasternak served as *Newsline*'s managing editor and as an occasional newscaster.

Pasternak was the spark plug behind the allvolunteer *Amateur Radio Newsline* bulletin--which was relayed on repeaters around the US and elsewhere--as well as the creator and administrator of the annual Young Ham of the Year Award.

Pasternak was the only person ever chosen to receive both the Dayton Hamvention Special Achievement (1981) and Radio Amateur of the Year (1989) awards.

-- ARRL WV SM, SK --

ARRL West Virginia Section Manager Charles L. "Charlie" Hardy-WV8CH of Fayetteville, died 14 June, apparently as the result of an accidental electrocution while he was working on an antenna at his home. He was 50 and had been a radio amateur since 2008.

Ed. Note: This isn't the first time hams have been electrocuted while doing antenna work. If you are among the fortunate few who can put up antennas, do be extra careful if any power lines are anywhere near where you're working.
