Tamiami Amateur Radio Club Minutes of the Meeting June 8, 2016

President Andy Durette, KB1HIP called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with a pledge to the flag.

The following visitor was recognized and welcomed: Will Wright, KM4EAV.

MINUTES: The minutes of the May meeting were accepted upon motion and approval.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Club account had a beginning balance in May of \$6,364.85. Receipts totaled \$145.00. Expenses were \$180.00. The ending balance was \$6329.85. A motion was made to accept the report. It was seconded and approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SUNSHINE: Nothing discussed.

VE TESTING: Jack Sproat, W4JS, reported that there are ten candidates who will take the tests this Saturday at the Jacaranda Library. (It was subsequently learned that 13 candidates attended and all were successful.)

LIAISON TO QCWA: Jack Sproat, W4JS, reported that 18 members (spouses and friends) attended the May lunch of Suncoast Chapter 53 at the Hibachi Grill in Venice.

MEMBERSHIP: The number of TARC members by category is: Regular 51, Student 7, Life 4, complementary 1, for a total of 63.

OLD BUSINESS: Fred Lathwood, KJ4TNI, delivered coffee and donuts to the Amateur Radio station operators who operated the TARC station during the Sharks Tooth Festival. The TARC membership voted to repay Fred for the cost of the coffee and donuts. Fred promptly donated the reimbursement to the Special Olympics.

NEW BUSINESS: The Memorandum of Understanding concerning control and supervision of Repeaters between TARC and Mr. Stewart Haag, W4MO, was put before the TARC membership by a motion to accept this MOU via a handshake agreement for three months. The vote was one against and the remainder of the members for. The motion passed and the TARC has entered into a hand shake agreement for three months.

Purchase of Projector: The club needed a projector to present programs both at the USCG center and other locations. Purchase of a new projector for \$400.00 was moved, seconded, discussed and approved.

Repeater Committee: Stew Haag, W4M0, and Guenther Henning, AJ4QX, volunteered to join

Trustee Glenn Hyde, N4MXQ, on this committee.

New Membership: TARC members suggested a number of ways to encourage new membership:

- 1. Letters to Home Owners Associations identifying what Amateur Radio Operators could do for the community in the event of a natural disaster.
- 2. Continue and improve the positive relationship with the High School Ham Club.
- 3. Initiate Internet outreach via: Meet Up Groups for individuals interested in Ham Radio; Prepper (prepare for disaster) groups; Hiking Groups, etc.; Use of YouTube to show the advantages of Ham Radio for the advantage of these groups.
- 4. Reach out to Boy Scout and Girl Scout Councils to serve as subject matter experts for Radio Merit badges and Scout Radio Jamborees.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting adjourned at 7:30 PM. There were 17 members and one quest present.

PROGRAM: Bob Miller, KJ4NLP, presented a program about the history, construction and maintenance of the Sutro communications tower in San Francisco. CA.

-- JUNE SOLAR ACTIVITY --

Throughout June the 10.7 cm Solar Flux ranged from 73 to 94, with a mean value of 81.9 (vs. 123.2 for June 2015 and 122.2 for June 2014), and the A_p index was \geq 7 on 21 days. Through 29 June, the sunspot number ranged from 0 to 48, with a mean of 17.4 due to 11 spotless days.

Space weather during June was relatively quiet with only six C-class flares through the 29^{th} . Geomagnetic disturbances peaked the A_p to 56 on the 5^{th} and 6^{th} and to 94 on 14 June.

-- JULY FORECAST -

Solar activity is expected to be very low, with a slight chance of C-class flares.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at quiet to unsettled conditions 01-05 July with isolated active conditions possible on 03 July due to a recurrent negative polarity CH HSS. Quiet conditions are expected on 06 July. Quiet to unsettled conditions are expected from 07-12 July with minor storms possible on 11 July and active periods likely on 12 July due to effects from a recurrent positive polarity CH HSS. Mostly quiet conditions are expected to return from 13-18 July with unsettled periods possible on 14-15 July. Quiet to unsettled conditions are expected on

19-21 July due to negative polarity CH HSS effects with an isolated active period likely on 19 July. Quiet conditions are expected 22-26 July with quiet to unsettled conditions 27-31 July with active periods likely 30 July.

The 10.7 cm Solar Flux should range from 77 to 82 and average 80.0 during July.

-- DX TO PLAN/LOOK FOR --

As can be noted above, DX will be hard to come by during July for several reasons. For one, Solar Cycle 24 is about finished as the Sun was spotless for 11 days during June. No openings are forecast on the higher DXing frequencies. What is the budding DXer to do?

- 1. Concentrate on the lower bands.
- 2. Consider the potential for Sporadic E openings on 6 meters.
- 3. Learn enough Morse Code to recognize your call sign, as CW will be readable when Phone is not.
 - 4. Utilize RTTY, PSK or JT65 modes.
- 5. Be Patient. For instance, that Swaziland station will be much easier to work in December.

-- SUPER QRO? --

Sometime ago, your editor commented in a letter to a friend, who is a well-known DXer/contester living up in Maryland, that "a Russian I worked a few months back told me he was running 4 Kw, but that he had a 10 Kw power supply! No doubt it came from California!!"

My friend's response was quite enlightening. He has been told by a number of Russian hams, in "eyeball QSOs", that it was routine for the big contest clubs to have 10 or 15 Kw amplifiers, mostly Soviet military surplus. He also wrote me that "some sunrise (on 75 meters) when you hear JA(---) on the band, just remember my telling you that you will be listening to a 40 Kw surplus Japanese military amplifier. Lots of JA's run 5 Kw or so.....When I visited JA(+++), I wit-

nessed the operation of a 15 Kw amp with my own eyes. The lights sure dimmed when that baby was keyed!"

We used to joke a lot about "California Kilowatts," mostly out of envy over the W6's working Pacific DX which we couldn't even hear, here on the "right coast." As a whole, US hams are pretty conscientious about observing our power limits, although amps are commercially available which can exceed those limits. But 40 Kw? THAT'S ANOTHER STORY!!
