-- PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE --

This past month was another busy one for me. While the scheduled work on the repeaters' antennas was delayed one week, Ron LeBrun-KB4RON and Julio Peralta-W4HY carried out the changes in fine order. The 444.10 MHz antenna is up at 200', right on top of the tower. The 146.805 MHz antenna has the top of the array at 200'. Both repeaters are running normally and the results are as good as expected. Now, if we could just get more members to make use of these two repeaters!!!!

While on the tower, Ronnie removed the lower multi-band inverted-v antenna. The Flex-3000 that utilized that antenna was experiencing interference, such that it was not of use. The Flex and the antenna have now been reinstalled elsewhere, with the peak of the antenna up at 60'. Again, our members are encouraged to make use of these two remote controlled radios.

I went up to the Dayton Hamvention and found it to be well attended, with some new products on display for the first time. However, I'm really looking forward to going over to Friedrichshafen, Germany in June for what is, without a doubt, the largest hamfest in the world. I may not understand a lot of the lingo being spoken around me over there, but some sights speak louder than words.

I'm making one more appeal that our members make use of our repeaters and remote HF radios. A lot of time and money have been invested in these facilities, and it's a crying shame that they are so under-utilized. Turn on your FM radios and/or your computers, and make use of these communications tools.

TAMIAMI AMATEUR RADIO CLUB Minutes of the Meeting 04 May 2010

President Stew Haag-W4MO called the meeting to order at 6:09 PM and, following a flag salute, introductions were made all around. Lin DeVecchio-N2ROM from Sarasota was welcomed as a visitor.

MINUTES – Secretary Jack Sproat-W4JS asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the 06 April 2010 meeting as published in the May 2010 issue of *The Communicator*. Dil Kay-W8DIL so moved, seconded by Guenther Hennig-AJ4QX, and passed.

CORRESPONDENCE – Nothing received or sent during the past month.

TREASURER'S REPORT — Treasurer Don Jansen-Kl4VGE reported that the starting balance was \$1936.38. Receipts were \$25.00 from the April 50/50, \$30.00 from 2010 membership dues payments, \$24.00 Scholarship Donation by Jim Murdock-KG4KOT, and \$16.00 for call sign badges, totaling \$95.00. Expenses were \$14.34 for DayStar Internet service, \$21.75 for three call sign badges, and \$289.48 for 180' of LMR600 coax cable for the 2-meter repeater antenna, totaling \$325.57. The 04 May 2010 ending balance is \$1705.81. San Yoder-K3SY moved to approve the report, seconded by Ron Hogarth-K4AUX, and passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SUNSHINE –Matt Klapp-W2EQV commented that all was quiet.

VE TESTING – Jack-W4JS reported that our next regularly scheduled VE session will be at 10 AM on 08 May, with probably three candidates. In addition, there will be an extraordinary VE session the same day at the Sarasota Red Cross building at 5:30 PM.

REPEATER/TECHNICAL – Switching placement of the 146 and 444 MHz antennas on the tower should take place this Friday or Saturday, with new LMR600 coax being installed to the 2-meter antenna at its new location. It is expected that these antenna revisions will result in improved operation of the two repeaters. In response to Stew's query of how many members present have 440 capability, a show of hands indicated about eight or more members.

CLUB PROPERTY – No inventory changes. **PUBLICITY/MEMBERSHIP** – San Yoder-K3SY reported that we now have 88 members, including seven Life Members, 18 First-Year Free members, and 63 paid-up members.

NET OPERATIONS – Net Manager Bob Murphy-WA1UHG was not present.

LIAISON TO EARS – Conrad Owens-WA3RRS reported that EARS is looking for a site for this year's Field Day operation.

LIAISON TO QCWA – Jack-W4JS stated that Suncoast Chapter 53's 07 April luncheon/meeting attracted 37 members/spouses/friends. Tomorrow, 05 May, the Chapter will meet at 11:30 AM at Denny's on Bee Ridge Road in Sarasota. Hans Napfel-WB2ZZB will give a PowerPoint presentation on his travels in Egypt.

OLD BUSINESS – Stew-W4MO has met with several persons at the company that owns the repeater site, however, discussion of a lease agreement has not come up.

Jon Hamlet-W4ZW provided updates on our current relationships with organizations and schools.

Pine View School – Graduating Senior Zhu Simeng-KJ4KTI received notification that he will receive a ham radio scholarship..

Sarasota Military Academy – Jon gave a PP presentation on EchoLink to a small group of students.

Suncoast Polytechnical High School – Students are busy with preparation from school exams. During a recent demonstration at the school, Jon attracted attention while attempting a moonbounce contact.

Riverview High School – Nothing from this school as yet.

Sarasota Red Cross – All equipment has been repaired. Planning to participate in Field Day while using the Red Cross communications trailer from, as yet, an undetermined location.

NEW BUSINESS – <u>Bylaws Amendment</u> – Stew announced the following: In an effort to retain younger members who were granted First Year Free status, but none of whom stayed on to become a full, dues paying member, at our April meeting the membership voted that we establish a new membership category for students. 

-- MAY SOLAR ACTIVITY --

Through 30 May the Solar Flux ranged from 69 to 83, with a mean value of 74.0 (vs. 70.6 for May 2009 and 68.4 for May 2008). The A-index was \geq 7 on 13 days. The average daily SSN was 17.6, with the Sun being spotless for 11 days.

Sunspot Regions 1064 thru 1075 formed during May. While several C-class solar flares occurred during May, the geomagnetic field disturbances during May were generally due to coronal mass ejections and the resultant high speed solar wind speeds.

-- JUNE FORECAST --

No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit. Solar flux are expected to be at high levels 01-09 June. The geomagnetic field

should be quiet to unsettled 01 June. Quite levels should prevail 02-14 June. Quiet to active levels are expected 15-16 June, with generally quiet levels through to 30 June. June's solar flux should average 75.5.

-- 2009 DX MARATHON AWARD WINNER --

CQ sponsors an annual DX Marathon to see how many DX countries and CQ Zones can be worked during the calendar year by the participating stations. For the 2009 event, 320 stations in 48 countries and 23 CQ zones submitted logs, and the results were published in the June 2010 issue of *CQ*.

While well-known DXer Bob Locher-W9KNI worked 281 countries and all 40 zones in the Mixed/Unlimited category, TARC's Jack Sproat-W4JS took First Place in the All SSB/Unlimited category, having worked 244 countries in all 40 zones during the 12-month period.

In 2008, First Place in All SSB went to OZ1ADL, who worked 241 countries. So, in spite of there being 3% fewer countries being available during 2009, both the Mixed and All SSB winners produced more countries worked.

-- RELOCATED ANTENNA ARRAYS --



Following the work of Ron LeBrun-KB4RON and Julio Peralta-W4HY, the 440 MHz 4-bay array is on top of the 200' tower, with the 2-meter 4-bay array immediately below. The 440 array is fed with 3/4" hard line; the 2-meter array with new LMR-600, which is electrically equivalent to 1/2" hard line. Now, folks, make use of them!
