TAMIAMI AMATEUR RADIO CLUB Minutes of the Meeting 14 February 2008

Starting a 6:35 PM, prior to the membership meeting, Stew Haag-W4MO provided an Introduction to EchoLink and the use of Skype and "magicJack" as alternative means of telephone communication. This discussion ceased for commencement of the program.

President Stew Haag-W4MO called the meeting to order at 7:08 PM and led the pledge of allegiance. Jon Krijgsman-N1BDF and his XYL, Pam, and Eric Owen-KD4MZM were recognized as guests. Introductions were then made all around.

MINUTES –Secretary Jack Sproat-W4JS asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the 17 January 2008 meeting as published in the February 2008 issue of *The Communicator*. Mike Hickey-NY4P so moved, seconded by Bob Marchese-K1NOK, and passed.

CORRESPONDENCE – Jack-W4JS read excerpts from a letter received from the Venice Public Library, thanking the TARC for the \$65 donation (from funds retained from the VE test fees). Jack also commented on an e-mail exchange regarding Special Event Station W0S,

which will be commemorating the sinking of the *Titanic* the same weekend as we will be active with K4S from the Sharks Tooth Festival, 11-13 April 2008.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Treasurer Don Jansen-KI4VGE reported that the 17 January 2008 starting balance was \$2994.63. Receipts were \$28.00 from the January 50/50 drawing, \$187.00 from membership dues, and \$5.00 miscellaneous, totaling \$220.00. Expenses were \$14.45 for Internet service at the repeater, \$11.20 for newsletter printing and stamps, and \$8.20 for stamps, totaling \$55.60. The 14 February 2008 ending balance is \$3159.03.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SUNSHINE – Matt Klapp-W2EQV reported everything to be up to date, and no updates were offered from the floor.

VE TESTING – Jack-W4JS reported that our one candidate at the 09 February VE session successfully upgraded from Technician to General Class.

REPEATER/TECHNICAL – Stew-W4MO reported that the equipment at the repeater site is working properly.

CLUB PROPERTY – Mike-NY4P asked about the status of the club's IC-746. Jack-W4JS replied that it was currently with Jeff-W9NYX and Jeff Watson-KI4QOG. Inquiries will be forthcoming to determine if the "loaned out" equipment is being used and/or if other members could possibly put the equipment to better usage.

PUBLICITY/MEMBERSHIP – Don-KI4VGE reported that we now have 83 members, including five Life Members and four First-Year Free members.

NET OPERATIONS – Net Manager Bob Murphy-WA1UHG was not present, and no report was offered. Stew-W4MO commented that members using EchoLink can check into any of the TARC nets, even if they do not have an operational radio.

PUBLIC RELATIONS – Diana Gregory-KI4GRF reported no progress getting anything published in the *Venice Gondolier Sun*.

LIAISON TO EARS – No one from EARS was present, however, flyers for the Charlotte County Hamfest were distributed.

LIAISON TO QCWA – Jack-W4JS reported that 31 members and friends attended the 06 February lunch/meeting of Suncoast Chapter 53 at Denny's up in Sarasota. Jack-W4JS showed photos and described the towers and beams he's had in the past, with emphasis on his newly installed Rohn tower and SteppIR beam. The next meeting will be 05 March, and all are invited.

OLD BUSINESS – Two items are carried over:

- ➤ Jack-W4JS reported that the DX Net is attracting an average of 11 stations, and reminded all that this net meets every Wednesday at 8:00 PM on the W4AC 146.805 repeater.
- ➤ Jack also reported that the TARC officers had decided that the potential topics were too diverse for an on-the-air Computer Net, and that such topics were better discussed on a one-to-one basis. In response for a request as to who would be willing to mentor such sessions, Stew-W4MO offered his knowledge and residence. The first session will begin around 9:00 AM, after breakfast at Peach's, and will be held on a monthly basis. Jack-W4JS will email members advising them of this activity, with a request for topics of interest for discussion.

NEW BUSINESS – Jack-W4JS stated that, following the suggestion of Mike-NY4P at the January meeting, he had sent e-mail to all members (having that capability), requesting photos of their stations and a brief biographical sketch for use in both the newsletter and the TARC web site. Response to date has been very poor! Guenther Hennig-KF4WFA commented that he is not receiving TARC e-mail. Stew-W4MO will be working on Guenther's computer in the near future, hopefully resolving this prob-



-- FEBRUARY SOLAR ACTIVITY --

During February, the Solar Flux ranged from 70 to 73, with a mean value of 71.2 (vs. 77.8 for February 2007 and 76.6 for February 2006). The A-index was \leq 10 on 18 days.

Geomagnetic field activity was quiet, with unsettled to active conditions 01-04, 10-16 and 28-29 due to recurrent coronal hole high speed streams.

-- MARCH FORECAST --

During March, solar activity is expected to be very low. No proton events are expected. The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected reach high levels except 08 March. Solar flux should average 70 during the month.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be unsettled to active 01 March from recurrent coronal hole high speed streams (HSS). Quiet to unsettled conditions are expected 02-07 March. Activity is expected to increase to unsettled to active levels 08-13 March with minor to major storm periods at high latitudes due to recurrent coronal hole HSS. Quiet to unsettled levels are expected 14-25, then increasing to unsettled to active 26-28 due to recurrent coronal hole HSS. Activity should decrease to quiet to unsettled conditions 29-31 March.


PROGRAM – Bob-N1RA offered a detailed program and illustrated discussion of using the W4AC Packet Gateway Station on 145.610 MHz.

-- STATUS OF CYCLE 24 --



A most recent view of the Sun shows it to be spotless but with significant coronal holes, which can emit high speed streams affecting the Earth's geomagnetic field. The Sun was spotless on 19 days during February.

NOAA recently published the "Predicted Sunspot Numbers & Radio Flux" prepared by the Solar Influences Data Analysis Center in Belgium. Their forecast shows Cycle 24 sunspot activity increasing in November 2008 and peaking in January 2012 with 113 spots. Stable 15-meter propagation to Japan and Southeast Asia will occur after September 2009.

.—LEARNING ABOUT PACKET --



-- SNOWBIRD NET HAS QSY'd --

The Snowbird Net has changed its 20-meter frequency. This net, which starts at 10:00 AM Eastern time, now meets on 14.293 MHz.

-- VP6DX SETS NEW RECORDS --



If you didn't work the VP6DX Ducie Island DXpedition, you must not have been on HF over the past weeks. The stations were on the air over some 15 days, amassing a total of 183,686 QSOs. There was good to excellent propagation from this area, and it was about impossible to not tune across their consistent signals. A lot of excellent planning plus great operators made this an outstanding DXpedition.
