President Fred Lathwood-KJ4TNI called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM and, following a flag salute, introductions were made all around. Jim Dirksen-W8MDM from Sarasota was welcomed as a new member. Joe Thiel-WA1VWP from Venice, Eric Owen-KD4MZM from Sarasota and Carol Witt, XYL of Dave-WD9W were welcomed as visitors.

**MINUTES** – Fred requested a motion to accept the minutes of the 13 March meeting as published in the April issue of *The Communicator*. Dave Witt-WD9W so moved, seconded by Hans Napfel-WB2ZZB, and passed.

**CORRESPONDENCE** – On 04 April, as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, and having less than \$50,000, an e-Postcard tax return was filed with and accepted by the IRS.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Treasurer Don Jansen-KI4VGE read the Treasurer's Report for March. The starting balance was \$3800.04. Receipts were \$100.00 from membership dues, \$18.00 donation from Fred Lathwood-KJ4TNI and \$18.00 from the March meeting 50/50, totaling \$136.00. Expenses were \$11.10 to Birch Communications for Internet service. The ending balance is \$3924.94. Roger Schmitt-KY4RS moved for acceptance of the report, seconded by Bob Faulcon-N1LVO, and passed.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**SUNSHINE** – Guenther Hennig-AJ4QX gave a description of how he fell and broke his arm when disembarking the cruise ship in Port Everglades following an extensive cruise around South America.

**VE TESTING** – Several candidates are expected at our 13 April VE session, including Venice High School students.

**REPEATER/TECHNICAL** –Both repeaters are operational.

**PUBLICITY/MEMBERSHIP** – San Yoder-K3SY advised that, as of the 22 March roster update, we have 53 paid members and five Life Members, for a total of 58 members.

**NET OPERATIONS –** No comments were offered.

LIAISON TO QCWA – There were 25 members, spouses and friends present at the Suncoast Chapter 53 lunch/meeting on 03 April at Denny's on Bee Ridge Road, Sarasota. The program was a look at the Galapagos Islands, highlighting an Audubon Society tour Lenee and Conrad Owens-WA3RRS took there last year.

All are welcome to join us the first Wednesday of the month around 11:15 AM.

**OLD BUSINESS –** Fred-KJ4TNI reviewed that status of member support for our providing communications support for the Sharks Tooth 10-K Run on 13 April and/or operation of K4S from the Sharks Tooth Festival site. There was show of hands by 10 members for monitoring the 10-K Run. Andy Durette-KB1HIP has received the 2-element tri-band beam for use at the site.

**NEW BUSINESS** – Fred presented Jack Sproat-W4JS with an ARRL VE pin in recognition of his years of service as the VE Team Liaison

**COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR** – Jack-W4JS advised that DX on 10, 12 and 15 meters has been excellent over the past 10 days or so, with stations in Cocos-Keeling Islands, Indonesia, India, Hong Kong, Thailand and the United Arab Emirates being worked on those bands. Jack prodded the members to get on the air.

**ADJOURNMENT** – A motion to adjourn at 7:35 PM was made by Bob Avrutik-N1RA, seconded by Dave Witt-WD9W, and passed. There were 22 members and three visitors present.

**PROGRAM** – Tom Fraser-AK4ZM introduced his program on the first Antarctic expedition by Admiral Richard E. Byrd, based on his personal research. With numerous period photos, Tom told of the previous expeditions, both successful and failures, and that Byrd wanted to fly over the South Pole—a first time accomplishment. Tom's presentation captured the attention of all present.

#### -- APRIL SOLAR ACTIVITY --

The Solar Flux ranged from 99 to 154, with a mean value of 125.0 (vs. 113.2 for April 2012 and 112.2 for April 2011), and the A-index was ≥ 7 on six days. The sunspot number through 29 April ranged from 86 to 162, with a mean of 111.0. Sunspot Regions 1710 to 1735 were active, with four M-class and 188 C-class flares. In spite of such extensive flare activity, major disturbances to the geomagnetic field only occurred 13-14 and 23-26 May.

#### -- MAY FORECAST --

Solar activity is expected to be low with a chance for M-class flares through 07 May as Region 1731 remains on the visible disk. Activity is expected to decease to very low to low levels through 08 May. Activity will likely increase to low with M-class flares likely when Region 1726 returns on 09 May. Region 1731 returns on 20 May, keeping levels low with M-class flares likely through the end of the month.

No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at moderate to high levels 01-02 May due to CH HSS effects. Values should decrease to normal to moderate levels from 03 through 21 May. Another increase to moderate to high levels due to recurrent CH HSS effects is expected 22-25 May.

The geomagnetic field should be at mostly quiet levels through 20 May. Minor storming is possible 21-23 May due to recurrent CH HSS. Mostly quiet levels should return 24 and 25 May and continue through the end of the month.

The Solar Flux should range from 120 to 140 and average 130.2 during May.

#### -- NOTABLE DX DURING APRIL --


A potpourri of good DX was available during April. VK9CZ from Cocos-Keeling Island ran up 26,000 Qs in two weeks. 5W0M from Samoa managed 67,000 Qs in two weeks. FH/DL7BC was active from Mayotte. Two German ops on Tokelau logged 14,600 Qs in about 10 days. Then Pai-VU2PAI and Krish-W4VKU/VU2VKU took to the bands as 8Q7KP from the Maldives.
