TAMIAMI AMATEUR RADIO CLUB Minutes of the Meeting 13 August 2009

President Stew Haag-W4MO called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM and led the pledge of allegiance. Introductions were made all around. Potential hams Judy and Greg Dilger of Venice were welcomed as visitors.

MINUTES – Secretary Jack Sproat-W4JS asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the 09 July 2009 meeting as published in the August 2009 issue of *The Communicator*. Peter Pesa-N4RD so moved, seconded by Ron Hogarth-K4AUX, and passed.

CORRESPONDENCE – An advertising card was received from Project-Parts.com up in Clearwater, along with an e-mail notice of nominee being needed to replace AlanPickering-KJ9N as treasurer of the West Central Florida Group. In addition, a notice was received from the Foundation regarding its discontinuing use of the Community Room for afterhours' events.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Treasurer Don Jansen-KI4VGE reported that the starting balance was \$1468.25. Receipts were \$14.00 from the July 50/50, and \$15.00 dues payment, totaling \$29.00. Expenses were \$14.32 for DayStar Internet service at the repeater site, and \$31 for members' name tags, totaling \$45.34. The 13 August 2009 ending balance is \$1451.91. Bruce Brown-WA8IQF moved for approval of the report, seconded by Don Gray-WD7A, and passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SUNSHINE – Nothing reported.

VE TESTING – Jack-W4JS stated that there were three candidates at last Saturday's VE session. Jim Shortill-KJ4NDO earned his General Class upgrade, and two candidates—one from Sarasota and one from Bradenton—earned their Technician Class licenses

REPEATER/TECHNICAL – Stew reported there had been a lightning strike at the repeater, but all equipment and modes except for the packet gateway are functioning.

CLUB PROPERTY – No change reported in the Club property inventory.

PUBLICITY/MEMBERSHIP – Don-KI4VGE reported that we now have 92 members, including eight Life Members and 22 First-Year Free members.

NET OPERATIONS – Net Manager Bob Murphy-WA1UHG was not present.

LIAISON TO EARS – Konrad Owens-WA3RRS stated that he missed the July meeting.

LIAISON TO QCWA – Jack-W4JS reported that there were 14 members, spouses and friends at the 05 August lunch of Suncoast Chapter 53 at the Panda Pavilion in Venice.

OLD BUSINESS – <u>Generator Mainte-</u> <u>nance/Operation</u>: Konrad-WA3RRS has prepared instructions on how to set up the generator for operation and what equipment is to be connected during emergency operation. These instructions will be posted at the repeater site.



Of the sites listed as alternatives by the Foundation, only the two Venice libraries have meeting rooms available at no charge. Peter Pesa-N4RD moved that the Board of Directors determine a suitable location and that the membership would follow that recommendation. Bob Avrutik-N1RA seconded the motion, which passed.

COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR – Bob-N1RA announced that former TARC member Jack Schoenthaler-KI4REI is looking for about 20' of tower, if anyone knows where some many be available.

ADJOURNMENT – A motion to adjourn at 7:36 PM was made by Peter-N4RD, seconded by Bruce-WA8IQF, and passed. There were 13 members and two visitors present.

CURRENT/PENDING DX ACTIVITY & PROPAGATION HIGHLIGHTS



Solar Flux and K-index varied in accordance with USAF 45-Day A/P Forecast.

-- AUGUST SOLAR ACTIVITY --

Through 23 August, the Solar Flux ranged from 66 to 69, with a mean value of 67.3 (vs. 66.5 for August 2008 and 69.2 for August 2007). The A-index was \geq 7 on 8 days.

Solar activity was very low. Through 23 August, there have been no sunspots for 44 days.

Recurrent coronal hole high speed wind streams (HSS) caused unsettled to minor storm levels 06-07 August, unsettled levels 09 August, active levels 12-13 August, and unsettled to minor storm levels 19-21 August.



-- SEPTEMBER FORECAST --

Solar activity is expected to be very low. No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit. The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at

geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at normal flux levels. Solar flux should average 68 during September.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at quiet levels with a chance of unsettled conditions 02, 09-10, and 21-22 September due to recurrent HSS.
