Dits, Dues, and Dots...

Is your club membership information current?

HOW TO PAY YOUR CLUB DUES:

As a reminder, TARC has a tiered structure for yearly membership dues which are \$25 per year. Membership payments are due on January 1 each year. There is a 60-day grace period. ARRL Club Grant Request Made

The club applied for an ARRL Club Grant in July for \$11,200 to fund the building of a primary satellite tracking ground station similar to the one pictured above and a ham radio station for use at Pine View School. The Club Grant awards won't be announced until November so a fall back contact method is required. The Ft. Myers club has agreed to provide their track- ing station and an experienced operator to support an ARISS contact if needed.






Pine View School to Make ARISS Contact in Spring 2025

Pine View School (PVS) for the Gifted in Osprey was selected by the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) organiza- tion to participate in an ARISS contact mission sometime in the Spring 2025. The school's STEM curriculum will be weighted to space and ISS related topics in the Fall 2024. PVS has selected the Tamiami Ama- teur Radio Club to be their ham radio support team for making this

contact. Tom KE4RXM and Paul KN4BAR worked with the PVS STEM Director, Marie Rosander to develop an Equipment Plan required by ARISS to gain approval for a direct ISS contact from the PVS campus. As a part of this project we hope to provide PVS with an IC-7300 based ham radio



station and training and support to get as many students, faculty, and parents (if interested) an FCC amateur radio Technician Class operating license this Fall. We have applied for an ARRL Club Grant to do this.

Englewood Antenna Repairs Completed



The antenna for the 146.805 repeater located at the Englewood repeater site was damaged during hurricane Ian in 2022. The club received an insurance payout for the antenna, and purchased a new, much more robust, Sinclair antenna earlier this year.

On Tuesday, August 20 th, John and Jared Chaput of J.C. Tower

Services came over from Lake Placid to install the new antenna. The old antenna was removed and lowered to the ground, where the full extent of the damage was revealed. In addition to a significant bend in the antenna mast, at least one of the dipole elements was broken. The new antenna was carefully raised

into position and was mounted to the side of the tower at 190 feet. This mounting position, with the mast secured to the tower at the top and the bottom of the antenna, should protect the antenna from damage in any storm that doesn't knock the tower down. Informal testing and signal reports from club members indicate that the new antenna is working better than the old one, with much stronger signals received at several locations along the Suncoast.

Jim Miller arrived early and started activating at 8:10am and had 42 QSOs in 50 minutes including a path to park in the Washington DC area there was a 5-fer. The


operator N2NWK regularly activates in this location where he is within 100 feet of 5 parks at once. One call and you get credit for 5 parks.

Tamiami Amateur Radio Club, Inc.

The Tamiami Amateur Radio club was organized in 1960 to serve the Venice and surrounding area with emergency communications. The founders of our club realized that it is of paramount importance to organize the amateur radio operators in the area, to promote training and provide community ser- vice. We have had a proud history.

Following Hurricane Donna of 1960, a number of the radio amateurs in the Venice area decided to unite into a formal club. At 7:30 PM on 06 October 1960, twenty interested parties met at the Sun-Shine Kitchen, and E. B. Roberts was elected as temporary chairman. During the two-hour gather-ing, a committee consisting of Joe Barone, P. D. Baird and Martin Sharp was appointed to study and draw up bylaws for the organization.

In January 1985 the TARC was incorporated under the laws of Florida as a not-for-profit corporation and, in 2001, as a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization with the IRS.
